WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 2020-48, the Township Committee authorized the solicitation of proposals through the competitive contracting provisions of the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1 et seq., for purposes of selecting a qualified revaluation firm to complete a municipal-wide revaluation of the Township of Union; and

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2021, and consistent with the Request for Proposals Documentation issued by the Township, the Township received one proposal from Professional Property Appraisers, Inc. for the price of \$175,925.00; and

WHEREAS, the Tax Assessor and Assistant Township Attorney have evaluated Professional Property Appraisers, Inc.'s proposal and based thereon have determined that it is consistent with the Township's Request for Proposals Documentation and is most advantageous to the Township, price and other factors considered; and

WHEREAS, the Assistant Township Attorney recommends that the Committee awards a contract to Professional Property Appraisers, Inc. for the reasons set forth above and the reasons set forth in the report recommending an award to Professional Property Appraisers, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that there are sufficient funds available for this purpose in 10687720.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Union that:

1. The above preamble is incorporated herein as if set forth at length.
2. The Township Committee hereby awards the Agreement for Revaluation of the Township of Union to the firm of Professional Property Appraisers, Inc., with offices in Cinnaminson and Toms River, New Jersey, for the contract amount of \$175,925.00.
3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute an Agreement with Professional Property Appraisers, Inc. consistent therewith.
4. A copy of this Resolution, and the executed Agreement, shall be placed on file in the office of the Municipal Clerk.
5. The Clerk shall publish a notice in the official newspaper of the Township summarizing the award of the Agreement, including but not limited to the nature, duration, and amount of the Agreement, the name of the vendor and a statement that the Resolution and Agreement are on file and available for public inspection of the Office of the Township Clerk.

PAYROLL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH R&L DATA CENTER

A. WHEREAS, the Township requires the provision of specific payroll-related services for the officers and employees of Union Township; and

B. WHEREAS, the services previously provided by, or to be provided by, R&L on behalf of Union Township, and which are anticipated for the Term of this Agreement are set forth herein; and

C. WHEREAS, the Township explicitly acknowledges that the Township’s governing body has the authority to enter into this Agreement after the governing body’s due deliberation, review and approval of this Agreement, and said acceptance was memorialized by way of the Township’s Resolution Number 2021-111 ; and dated December 15, 2021

D. WHEREAS, Union Township further understands that various services, including but not limited to: Automatic Tax Services and Quarterly Automatic Tax Services, eg., Periodic Tax Payments, Responding to tax agency inquiries, Quarterly Preparation of Forms 941, NJ927 (NJ SUI/SDI Report), and PA State Withholding; Direct Deposit Services, eg., the creation of NACHA files, the initiation and transmission of direct deposits, responding to direct deposit inquiries, and all direct deposit-related file maintenance issues; and, electronic check stub deliveries are not services provided by R&L and are not contemplated herein by this Agreement. As such, Union Township acknowledges and understands that Union Township is required to enter into a third-party contract for the provision of those services that are not explicitly provided by R&L and which are not specifically set forth within this Agreement. Union Township agrees that any such agreement between itself and any third-party provider are independent arms-length transactions that neither bind R&L nor alter any provision contained within this Agreement with R&L; and

E. WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Parties and each of them that this Agreement is intended to comply with the requirements as set forth in N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.1, et seq., specifically, N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.6, which governs contract terms and conditions for contracts between “local units” and a “disbursing organization” as those terms are defined pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.2.

b. Committee Report

Mr. Severino reported the following:

- Updated the Committee on the noise reduction project at the shooting range located on Route 173.
- Asked about virtual access to Township meetings. Brief discussion followed.
- Suggested contacting JCP&L about decommissioning electrical service at the entrance to Stonebridge that was left by the Developer.

Mr. Stiger reported the following:

- Learned at the County Planning Board meeting that 579 Trail has Christmas Trees and the Beer Trail website link is operational.
- I 78 and Route 22 Committee is making the corridor attractive for home based businesses.
- Tourism ad campaign in Hunterdon County will be available for bidding in the first quarter of New Year and, American Rescue Plan Funds will be available for that purpose.
- The new Burn Building should be completed by 2022.
- As per November 10th minutes, the Committee agreed to have a meeting with PVFC regarding financing of the new Fire Truck. Before scheduling that meeting, Mr. Stiger said that he and Mr. Strauss are waiting for Chief Narbonne to schedule and hold a meeting regarding PVFC compliance with the Township Ordinance.

c. Finance Officer’s Report -

- Thanked Mr. Severino for his past 15 years of service.
- Would like the Committee to take some time during this Holiday season to spread good words to Township employees who for the last two years through COVID-19 crisis had kept the Municipal offices door open and even if closed assisted residents at the door or outside. No office employee worked from home, everyone came to work as scheduled. As the Personnel Administrator she said she would like the Committee to know

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that employees at the Municipal offices and the Road crew showed great resolve under difficult circumstances during the past two years.

- Asked that CFO and Clerk be allowed to carry one week of 2021 unused vacation to 2022.

The Committee allowed the request.

d. Pattenburg Volunteer Fire Dept. – Deputy Fire Chief present at the meeting

- Deputy Fire Chief Sadusky thanked Mr. Severino for his service to the Township.

e. Mayor’s Report

- The Mayor once again thanked Mr. Severino for his service on various boards, committees and commissions over the past 15 years. Mayor Mazza stated that Matt Severino was one of the most “level headed members of the Committee” he was always fair and willing to compromise.

Mr. Stiger, Township Clerk Ruta, Committeemen Elect Lordi and DeGiralamo also thanked Mr. Severino for his dedication and great service to the residents of Union Township. Mr. Lordi even told a very nice story about meeting Mr. Severino for the first time on a very hot summer day at the Recycling Center.

Mr. Severino expressed his appreciation to everyone for the recognition and kind comments.

Steve Wardell, 29 Frontage Road, as a member of the public extended his thanks to Mr. Severino for serving on the Committee all those years.
