WHEREAS, All New Jersey municipalities are now classified as Tier A communities; and

WHEREAS, Union Township was formerly classified a Tier B community; and

WHEREAS, Union Township has committed significant effort toward meeting its new MS4 Tier A permit compliance obligations; and

WHEREAS, The NJDEP MS4 Tier A permit requirements also advance the goals and purpose of the Highlands Act and Regional Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Highlands Council has made grant funding available to Highlands communities for work related to MS4 permit compliance; and

WHEREAS, The Highlands Council has requested that municipalities seek funding via grant applications that are categorized into annual scope of work requests; and

WHEREAS, Van Cleef Engineering Associates has prepared a 2024 Highlands Council Grant Application and Scope of Work to seek funding for planning, design and engineering expenses incurred to bring Union Township into compliance with the new permit standards. The scope of work is for a one-year period. The funding request is \$96,500.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Van Cleef Engineering Associates is directed to submit the 2024 Grant Application and Scope of Work to the Highlands Council on behalf of Union Township.

The Committee discussed the recent power outages due to tree branches with leaves and not necessarily dead trees coming down on power lines. JCP&L informed Mayor DeGiralamo that there are plans for vegetation control in Union Township next year. Discussion ensued regarding obtaining data from JCP&L to compare outage percentages in the area.

a. **Attorney’s Report** - Attorney Sharpe discussed a security alarm ordinance requested by the Fire Chief and sought direction from the Committee. The Committee indicated they do not want to require that residents or businesses

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register their systems with the Township. However, the Committee does want to establish escalating fines for repeated false alarms within a defined period, since Emergency services (fire and police) are required to respond to all alarms and false alarms tie up already limited resources.

b. **Mayor’s Report** – Mayor DeGiralamo discussed the initiative to beautify Hoffman Park and to make it more accessible. He announced the Hunterdon Games are about a month away.

c. **Committee Reports**

Mr. Wunder updated the Committee on the progress of the Neighborhood Watch program. He commented that the proposed plan of action requires the approval of the State Police.

Mrs. Cherney reported that she has been working with Chief Sadusky of the Pattenburg Volunteer Fire Company to put together a fundraising subcommittee. There are a number of ideas for fundraising events in 2024-2025.

Mr. Stiger reported that he and the CFO are waiting to hear from the County regarding the grant for the generator. He updated the Committee with regards to the Pattenburg Quarry’s donation of a 95-acre parcel of land to both the Township and the NJ Water Supply. The Township will ask for a Phase II review of soils from the DEP. Phase I was done many years prior and Phase II needs to be completed prior to obtaining the property for Open Space. He reported that the Welcome Wagon has distributed welcome packages to 16 families over the past weekend.

d. **Finance Officer’s Report** reported that the 2024-2025 tax bills were mailed out last Saturday. The tax rate dropped 1.2 cents from last year.

e. **Recreation Committee** – Eric Meissner, Recreation Chair, updated the Committee with current and new programs. He commented that there are upcoming Rutgers S.A.F.E.T.Y.
